This week is creativity week, we will be completing these activities inspired by the book 'Errol's Garden' by Gillian Hibbs.

Session 1 Read the poem 'My lonely Garden' by Nadim who is just 4 years old! Talk to a grown up about what you imagined in your mind. <i>What words helped you imagine this?</i> <i>How does it feel to be in the garden?</i> <i>What can you see, hear or touch?</i> Draw what you think Nadim's garden looks like.	Session 2 Read the poem 'My lonely Garden' by Nadim again. It is amazing that Nadim was 4 years old when she created this and was inspired by nature. If you can sit in your garden and observe. <i>What can you hear, see and smell?</i> <i>What can you touch?</i> <i>How does being outside make you feel?</i> Have a think of what 1 word you would use to describe nature. Challenge: Can you write a sentence using an adjective (describing word).	Session 3 If you can spend some time sitting in your garden or observing from the window what you can see and hear. Walk around in your garden is there anything that you love or fascinates you? Using a pencil and paper draw a natural object found in your garden. Remember you must keep looking at your object to be able to draw what it looks like.
Session 4 Listen to the beginning of 'Errol's Garden' by Gillian Hibbs. Story: Errol's Garden - YouTube Stop the story at 0.30 seconds and ask these questions: <i>Do you have any plants at home?</i> <i>What has happened in the story so far?</i> <i>What do you think might happen next?</i> <i>Do you think Errol wants a garden of his own?</i> Listen to the rest of the story and see if your prediction is correct	Topic - Fire! Fire! This term we are learning all about the Great Fire of London. Write down what you might already know about the Great fire of London, where it happened? How it started? Do you know how we behave around fire? And write down what you would like to learn about the Great fire of London.	Art - Self Portrait A self-portrait is a piece of art of ourselves. Have a look at the presentation to have a look at some self-portraits. Do you think they look exactly like the person? For this piece of artwork, you can use as many colours as you like! Using a mirror is very helpful to remind you what you look like as well - use whichever art materials you have available at home.
