- St Neots got its name from the saint Neot who created a monastery in the town. However the monastery closed after a short while and he moved to Cornwall.
- There is also a place called St Neots in Cornwall
- Gravel has been extracted in the Little Paxton for centuries
- The first gravel from Little Paxton was used to dress local roads

Fun fact! Kimbolton castle was originally a medieval

castle but was made into a stately home by Catherine of Aragon.

Learning Journey- Through this topic pupils will be learning about our local area. We are developing our geographical skills by identifying human and physical features in our local area, completing fieldwork and using compasses to identify the location of significant places.

Pupils will develop their enquiry skills and be asked to make inferences and explain their thinking. Pupils will analyse artefacts from the local area to explore the history within our soil.
