<p><b>LO: To understand the conventions of spoken word poetry.</b></p>	<p><b>LO: To compose a poem to perform orally.</b></p>	<p><b>LO: To perform the poem that I have composed.</b></p>	<p><b>LO: To compose an acrostic poem with the theme of Christmas.</b></p>	
<p>Use the PowerPoint to practice saying different sentences with different emotions. Think about how the sentences change their meaning depending on how we say them.</p> <p>Listen to <a href="#">How to perform poetry   English - Nothing Rhymes with Orange - YouTube</a> to demonstrate how to perform poetry.</p> <p>Choose one of the poems and practice performing it. Remember to think about changing your voice, making it louder or quieter, making it happier or more cross.</p> <p><b>Poems: The Rainy Day, Beach Orchestra, Autumn.</b></p>	<p>Use the PowerPoint to find out about onomatopoeia. Think of your own examples and create a mind map of them. We will use these in our poem later.</p> <p>Pick a theme that you think you can use a lot of onomatopoeia in e.g. <b>fireworks</b> and write a poem. It does not have to rhyme or have a certain number of beats per line. This is a freer way to write. Remember to use a comma and start a new line to show that we are taking a breath. e.g. <i><b>The sun is always shining, it makes us hot and warm.</b></i></p>	<p>Using your poem from last lesson, think about how you might perform it. Then, ask an adult to record you performing your poem and upload it to tapestry.</p>	<p>Choose a variety of the templates and create your own acrostic poems about Christmas. Try to challenge yourself to pick a tricky word.</p> <p>You can think of one word that starts with each letter if you are finding it really tricky but try to write a sentence for each letter.</p>
