This lesson will focus on active and passive voice in writing. Follow the lesson presentation and answer the questions. Closely examine the example sentences and practise writing sentences using both sentence structures. Passive voice is useful to take attention off of who did something by focusing attention on the object of the sentence. Activity 1: Follow the link to a recent story on the Newsround website. Read carefully and identify sentences which have been written using the active and the passive voice. Write down two examples of active voice and passive voice. Activity 2: Choose and complete Activity Sheet 1, 'using passive and active voice'. You may need to change some of the words when you change between active and passive voice, but the meaning of the sentence should be the same. Challenge: Find another member of your family to role play being an angry teacher. Use the passive voice to answer their questions to try to avoid trouble.	Spag focus - Semicolons.
