
Answers

7. What do you think the impact would have been on society today if the Council of Europe had not emphasised the importance of language learning?

Pupils' own responses, such as: I think that fewer people would be able to speak any additional languages if the Council of Europe had not emphasised the importance of language learning because they might not have realised how beneficial it is.

8. The Council of Europe wanted to raise awareness of three key points. Which of these points do you think is the most important? Explain your choice.

Pupils' own responses, such as: The point that I find to be the most important is that less widely used languages should be learnt by people in Europe. I find this the most important point because I don't think that rarer languages should be forgotten or overlooked in favour of those which are more prevalent.

9. Summarise what you think the author's intent was when they created this text.

Pupils' own responses, such as: I think that the author's intent in creating this text was to inform the reader about the European Day of Languages, to encourage them to learn a new language for themselves and to support them with learning a new language.

10. Would you like to learn another European language?

Give two reasons for your choice.
