<p>Personal, Social and Emotional Development</p> <p>Discuss things that you find challenging. What do you do to overcome the challenge? Think about the challenges people with a disability face. Eg people who are deaf, blind, use a wheelchair or people with a disability you cannot see. What challenges do they face and how can you help?</p> 	<p>Communication and Language</p> <p>Watch Miss Bleakley read <i>The Great Nursery Rhyme Disaster</i> on the school bedtimes stories channel on Youtube or you can access them on the school website. Can you sing your favourite nursery rhymes? What is your favourite? Can you learn a new nursery rhyme? Talk about the meaning of new words.</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=3wnHx8-kugU</p> 	<p>Physical Development</p> <p>Gross Motor- check out the KPA and GS PE Activity ideas on the website! Full of lots of activity ideas!</p> <p>Fine motor- using tweezers, chop sticks or two forks back to back with a hair band around the top encourage your child to pick some small objects up. Eg pasta pieces, lego, pom poms. Start a timer. How many can they transfer from one bowl to another in 1 minute? Can they beat their score?</p> 
<p>Literacy- Reading</p> <p>Can you complete this week's reading challenge?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read a book in bed. Read a book in your garden/ Read a book under a tree. Read a poem. Read a non-fiction book. 	<p>Maths- Number</p> <p>Groups of objects: throw a teddy bears picnic with up to 5 bears. Ask your child to give each bear the same number of items. Eg 'Can you give all the bears 2 sweets?' Then ask them how they will find out how many sweets there are all together? They will need to line them up to count them.</p> <p>Challenge: can you count in 2s?</p>	<p>Understanding the World</p> <p>Have a go at one of the science experiments in the attached link or make up your own! Send it to them on Tapestry. .</p> 	<p>Maths- Shape, Space and Measure</p> <p>Offline: Can you bake something delicious together? What do you need to help you measure the ingredients? Explore and use the scales together to weigh the ingredients.</p> 	<p>Expressive Arts and Design</p> <p>Play dress-up with costumes or a selection of clothes from different people in your family. Find funky hats, shoes, gloves, belts to accessorise your outfit!</p>
