








Reception Compulsory Home Learning for 18th -29th May 2020

<p>Personal, Social and Emotional Development</p> <p>Have a discussion about you are good at. What makes you special? What skills and abilities do you have? Do you have any special talents?</p> <p>Share your discussion on tapestry.</p> 	<p>Communication and Language</p> <p>Create a role play area in your home. This could be a home corner, a doctors, a shop, a castle, a fire station, a library etc. Allow your child to spend time creating the role play area. What things do they want to put in it? What will a shop/ kitchen/ fire station need?</p> 	<p>Physical Development</p> <p>Joe Wicks - Virtual PE teacher delivering 30 minute PE lessons Monday - Friday 9:00am</p> <p>Fine motor- stand some spaghetti upright in some playdough/ bluetac and thread cheerios onto it. How many can you slide on in 1 minute? Who can make the tallest tower of cheerios in 1 minute? Or thread penne pasta onto spaghetti or string. You could make a necklace!</p> 
<p>Literacy- Reading</p> <p>Choose your favourite book at home, read it and talk about why you like it. What happens in the beginning, middle and end? Or if it's a fact book- what's your best fact from the book?</p> 	<p>Maths- Number</p> <p>Offline: Estimation- Discuss what it means to estimate- 'have a sensible guess.' Have a look around your home for things you can estimate the number of. Eg estimate how many biscuits in the tin, how many shoes on the rack, how many books on the shelf, how many tins in the cupboard or how many teddies on the bed. Then count to find out if you were right. Ask your child to think about how they could record this maths problem. Let them record it in their own way.</p> 	<p>Understanding the World</p> <p>Seasons: What season are we in now? Talk about spring, summer, autumn and winter. Which months belong in which season? Look on Espresso for more information about seasons. What are the signs for each of the seasons?</p>
<p>Literacy-Writing</p> <p>Sing the alphabet and write it down. Be careful with your letter formation and check here if you aren't sure. Practise the letters you find tricky.</p> <p>https://www.kimboltonprimaryacademy.cambs.sch.uk/handwriting-in-ash-class/</p> 	<p>Maths- Shape, Space and Measure</p> <p>Offline: give your child a selection of object that can be sorted in different ways. Eg by colour, by size, by object, by material etc. Ask them to sort the objects into groups but don't tell them how to sort them. Discuss. Can they sort the same objects in a different way?</p>	<p>Expressive Arts and Design</p> <p>Dance around the room to your favourite song. Can you make up some new dance moves?</p> 
<p>Phonics</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Check out the daily phonics lessons on the Letters and Sounds Youtube page: https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCP_FbjYUP_UtldV2K_-niWw Splat: choose 6 cards from your phonics pack. Spread them out on the ground. An adult says one of the sounds and the child has to hit the correct sound.
