Bird Box Build

Last week was national nest box week, but I thought we would carry it on this week and build unusual bird boxes suitable for small garden birds. You can use many different household items Lego / Duplo (these would need gluing together to make sure they do not break) milk bottles, old large tin cans, the list goes on! Please do not over decorate it, some birds are put off by noise and shiny objects.



You may decide to make yours completely out of things you find outside. Once you have made it you will need to find the perfect tree/hedge to place it in. Fingers crossed you may even get a bird moving in!
