- 4. A librarian needs to organise 872 books! There are 8 shelves to put them on. If she divides the books equally, how many books will go on each shelf?
- 5. Here are 4 of J.K Rowling's Harry Potter books and the amount of pages each book has:

Harry Potter and the Philospher's Stone 223

Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets 251

Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban 317

Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire 636

How many pages are there in all 4 books?

How many more pages are in The Goblet of Fire than The Chamber of Secrets?

- 6. I started reading a book with thousands of pages! I read 48 pages every night for 65 days! How many pages have I read?
- 7. Can you work out how old David Walliams is from these clues?

His age is a multiple of 7
His age is an odd number
His age is a composite number
The digits of his age add up to 13

8. Can you work out how old J.K Rowling is from these clues?

Her age is a multiple of 5
Her age is over 40 but below 60
If you add up the digits of her age and multiply that by 10, you get 100

- 9. Boris Johnson has to read a very important document which is 2,754 pages long! He only has 9 days to read it! How many pages should he read each day to make sure he reads all of it?
- 10. Can you work out how old Julia Donaldson is from these clues?

Her age is an even number

Her age is over 50

The factors of her age include: 6, 8, 9, 12
