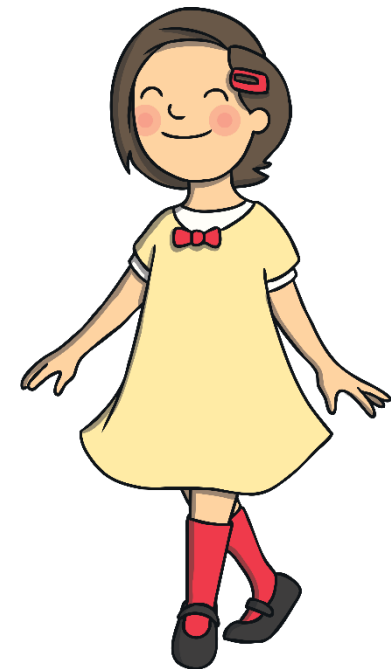
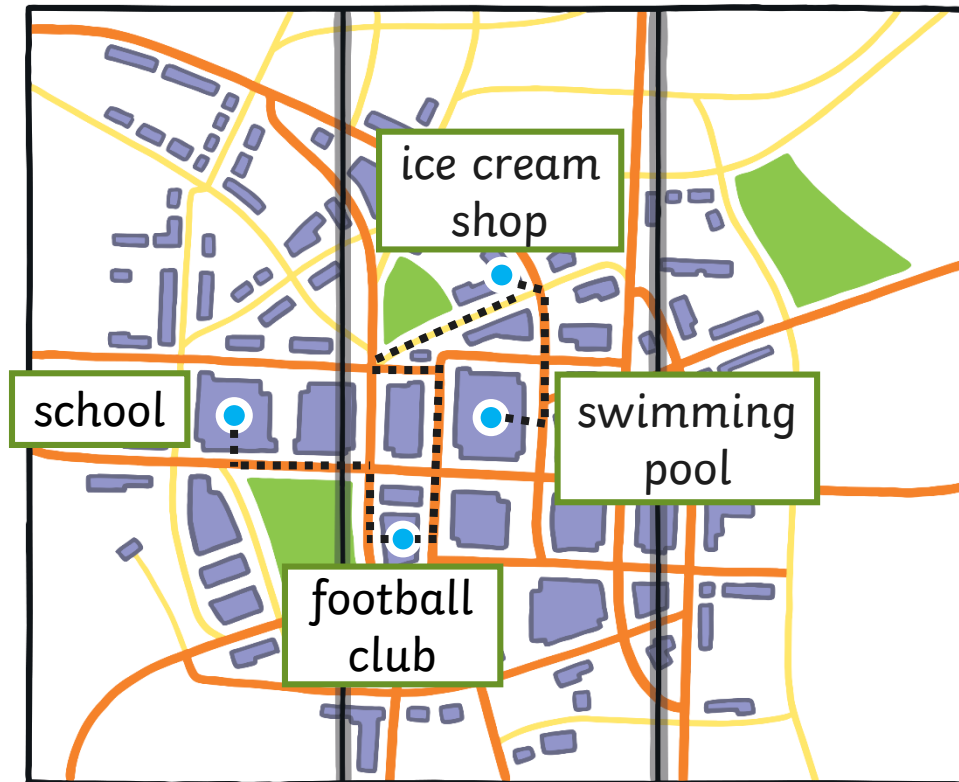

Look at Penelope's footprints. On your whiteboard, list the places she has been.

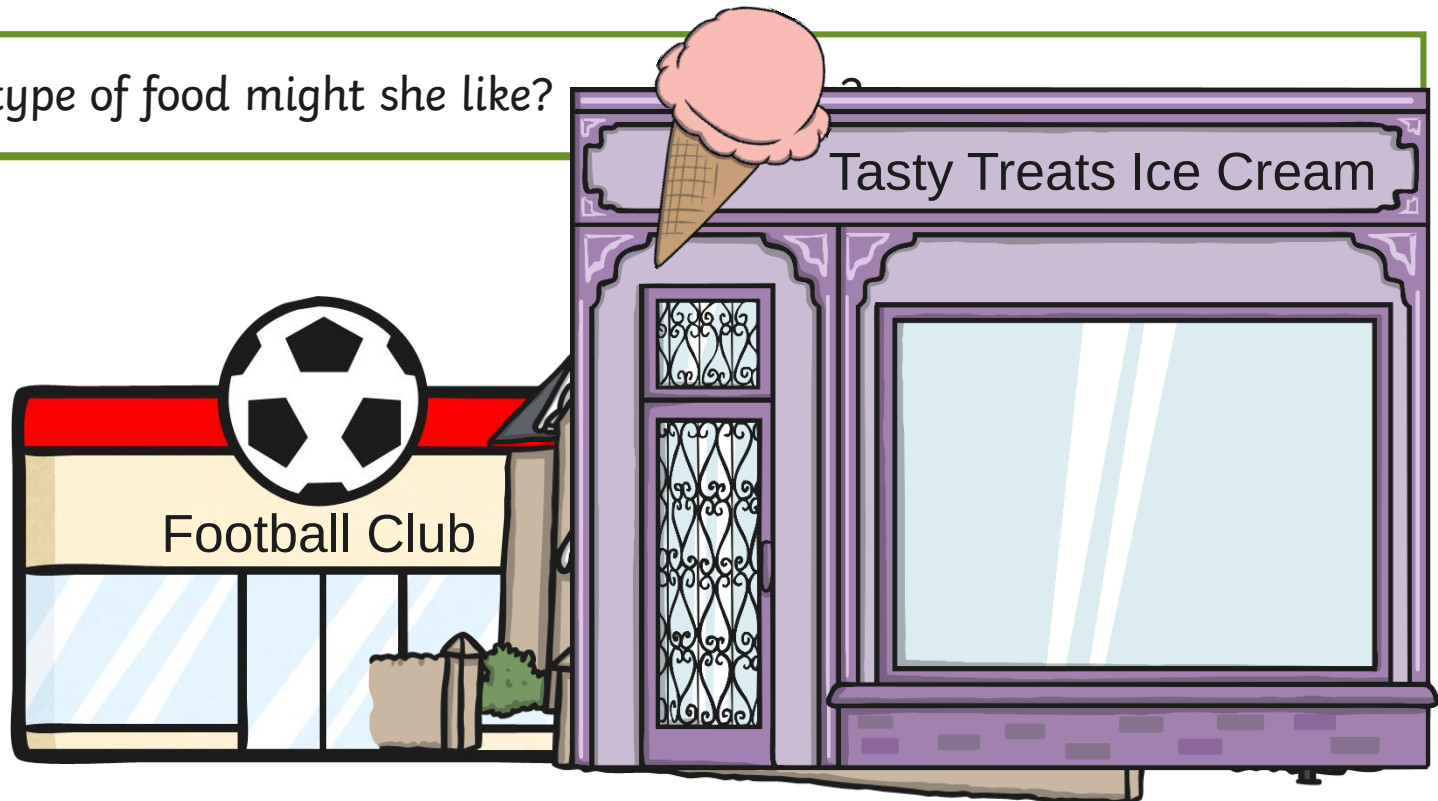


Footprints

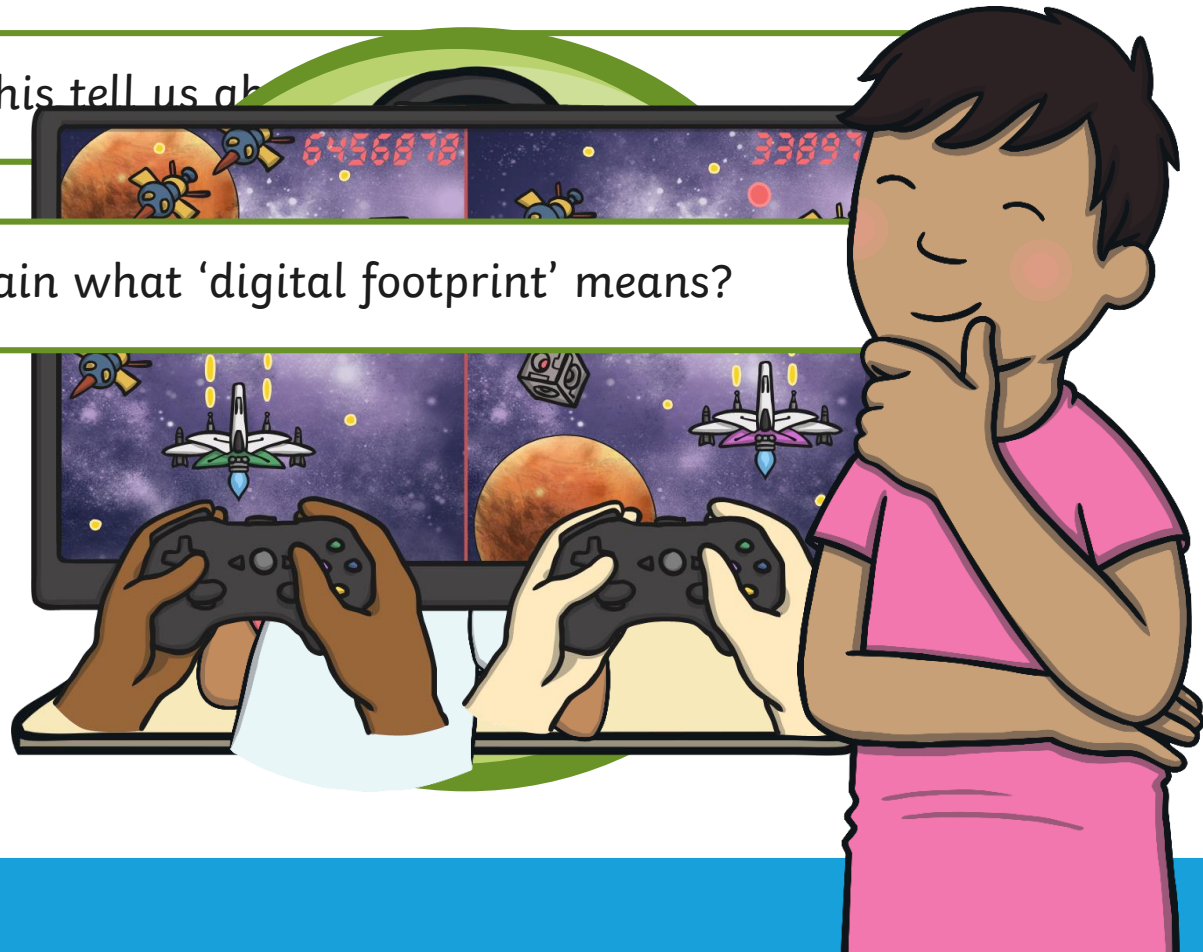
