LO: To research and organise factual information about Mahatma Gandhi.

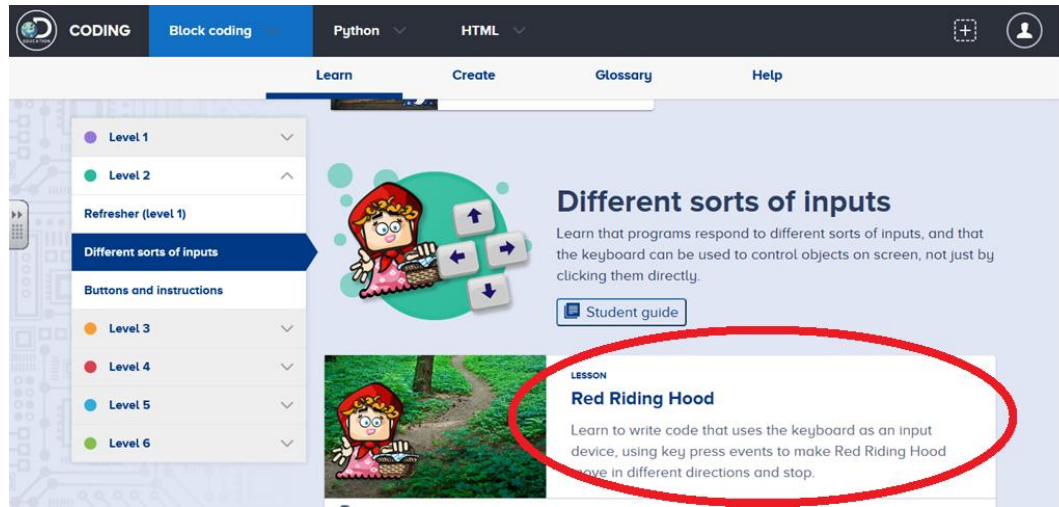
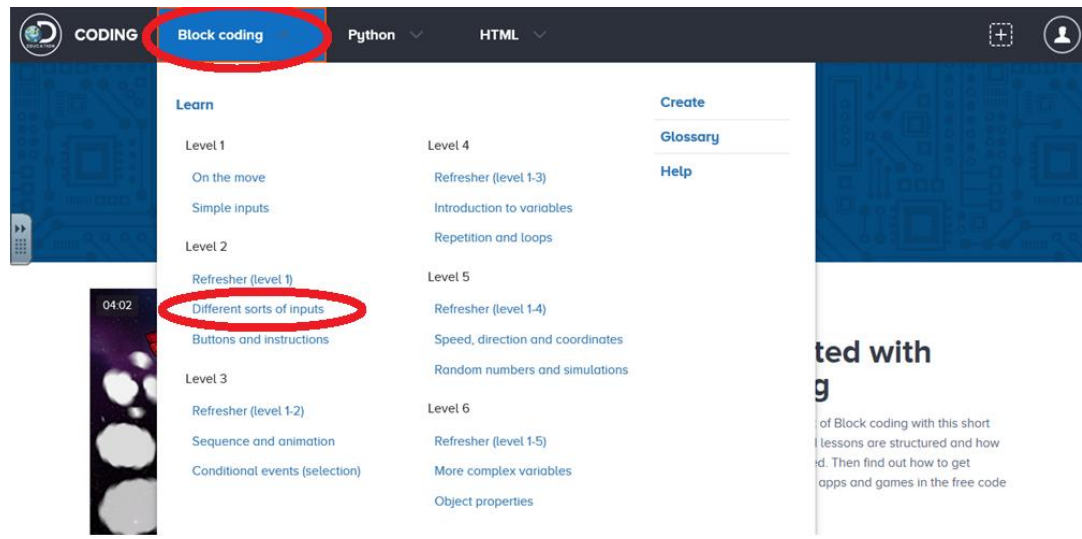
Watch Gandhi Lesson 1 and make some notes about what you learn.
