## <u>Science</u>

LO: To group rocks based on their properties.

You will be completing an investigation into the properties of rocks. There will be three tests- Permeability, Durability and Density. To test permeability can you add a few drops of water onto the rock and observe whether it is absorbed. For the durability test use either the pavement, or sandpaper. Finally for the density test, test the buoyancy by using a large container of water. Record your findings on the properties of rocks activity sheet. Extension: Tell me which groups the rocks you are using in your investigation belong to. Igneous, Sedimentary or Metamorphic
