

Year 6 Home Learning for Week Commencing 17th January 2022



Science

LO: To learn how gears and pulleys affect the amount of force needed.

Think back to last lesson- what is the scientific name for an object which allows you to exert more force?

In this lesson we will be taking part in a carousel of activities to investigate two simple machines- pulleys and gears. Can you locate any gears or pulley systems in your home? What are they used for?

Task A. Watch the two BBC class clips about pulleys and gears. Then complete the lever, gear or pulley activity sheet. **Challenge:** Write a paragraph to explain in your own words, what are the benefits and drawbacks of using simple machines to increase the force you can use?

Task B: Create a pulley system to help lift a heavy weight. Use the 'make a pulley' instructions to build your own pulley, or design and label a pulley system that you think would be most effective at lifting a heavy weight.

Task C: Use the 'making moving gears' resources to make a set of gears, and answer the questions given or research and explain how a bicycle's gears allow the rider to use force more effectively. Optional challenge-use a real world example in your explanation.

Plenary: Explain which mechanism (lever, pulley or gears) would be most suited for different jobs. Give reasons for your opinion!

Topic

LO: To examine how propaganda was used in WW1.

Propaganda is a type of persuasive advertising used by governments to influence people to behave in a certain way. Read through the lesson presentation and answer the questions to learn about propaganda.

Learning activity: Carefully examine the propaganda posters resource, which contains posters designed to try to get men to join the army. Each one uses emotions to try to persuade the audience. Identify which emotion it is trying to use, then rank the posters by how effective you thought they were. Can you explain your reasons why you think so?

Challenge: Do you think it is morally right for governments to use propaganda on their citizens? Write a short paragraph to explain your thoughts.
