Topic

LO: To write a diary entry in role as a plague doctor

Activity 1:

Research what it would have been like to be a doctor during the Great Plaque:

What did they wear to visit their patients?

What symptoms did their patients have?

What remedies and medicines would they have prescribed?

What would they have seen and smelt on the city streets?

Activity 2:

Imagine you are a plague doctor; write a diary entry showing a day in your life during the plague. Think about incorporating findings from your research as well as details about how you felt. Remember to use inference (show not tell) and your five senses.

Science

LO: To explain how a switch works and why they are needed

Activity 1:

Watch this Espresso video about <u>switches</u>. Then, work through the PowerPoint 'Splendid Switches'

Activity 2:

Draw a complete series circuit that, when the switch is closed, will make a bulb light and a buzzer sound. The PowerPoint 'Circuits and Symbols' might help you. Remember that the wires should be drawn as straight lines, to help keep the diagram simple and clear.

Activity 3:

Play the game 'Electrical Circuits - what's wrong?' Can you identify the errors?



Extension: A series circuit is great for powering an individual appliance but would it be good for lighting your home? Explain why.
