Topic

LO: To understand why James VI of Scotland became James I of England.

Activity 1: Queen Elizabeth I (1533-1603) never married or had children so who was heir to the throne of England? Why were they the next in line to the throne? What is meant by the term 'union of the crowns'? Research the answer to these questions and begin to complete the table (see resources) to show your findings. The PowerPoint in the resources may help you to understand.

Activity 2: What did King James I believe? Why did this cause problems with Parliament? What is meant by the term 'divine rights of kings'? Complete research and look through the statements from the differing points of view. Continue to document this in the table. Activity 3: Like James I, our Queen is the monarch of more than one country. Can you find out about another king or queen who reigns/reigned over more than one country and complete a fact file about them?
