PSHE

Our PSHE work over the next couple of weeks uses a book by Oliver Jeffers called *Here We Are.* There is a video on YouTube of a reading of the book

- Session 1: This session is about making sense
 of recent events. Draw all the things that
 play on your mind. This could be things that
 you are: curious about; confused about;
 excited about; worried about. After drawing
 these, write yourself a note of advice and
 encouragement regarding these thoughts.
- Session 2: Think of an individual you are inspired by. You can research this to find the person who inspires you most. Then paint this person. After you have painted the person you have chosen complete a short profile on this person, including their name, age and why they inspire you.
- Session 3: Reread the book. Think about what you have learnt about yourself, others and the world during this period of time. Has the recent experiences changed you or the way you view the world?
