Session 1 LO: to compare fiction and non-fiction texts.	Session 2 LO: to identify the features of a non-fiction text.	Session 3 LO: to ask and record questions using a question mark.
Input/ Task: Discuss the meaning of fiction and non-fiction. Do you have any fiction/ non-fiction books in your home? Can you sort them into fiction and non-fiction? Talk with a grown-up about the features of a non-fiction book. Key questions: What are the features of a non-fiction book? Why do we use non-fiction books? What's different between a fiction book and a non-fiction book?	Recap: recap some of the new vocab learnt yesterday, including fiction and non-fiction. Input: work through the PowerPoint and discuss the different features of a non-fiction book. Have you seen any of these features in your non-fiction books? Perhaps in your library book? Task: Using some post-it notes, label the following features in your own non-fiction book. Use your school library book if you don't have your own. (title, contents page, photo, caption, heading, sub-heading, index, glossary).	Recap: recap the features of a non-fiction text from the previous lesson. Input: We are going to be writing our own non-fiction texts about the Great Fire of London but first think about some of the questions you wrote last term about the Great Fire of London. Can you answer some of these questions now? Work through the PowerPoint and consider how to write a question using the question words and a question mark. Task: Write 3-5 questions about the Great Fire of London. Make sure you can answer them as we will need them next week.
