
Find as Many Words as You Can!



Reception LO: to write a sentence.

Must: Identify where the capital letter and full stop is placed.

Should: Use a capital letter and full stop in a simple sentence.

Could: Independently check it makes sense.


Year 1 LO: to use conjunctions to join two sentences.

Must: Identify conjunctions.

Should: Join 2 sentences together using a conjunction.

Could: Identify appropriate conjunctions to use in a sentence.

When we want to connect 2 sentences together we can use:

We can fly our kites or...

Various answers, for example:

We can fly our kites or ride our bikes. We can fly our kites or play football.

These examples both give an option that is different to flying a kite.



We use 'and' to join two words or sentences.



My gloves are blue and white.



Archie enjoys singing and he loves to dance.



We use 'but' when the second part of the sentence is different to what you might expect.



The big dog looks scary but he loves to have a cuddle.

We can also use the word 'or' to join two words or sentences.



Would you like an apple or a banana?

The word 'or' is used when we want to show that there are different options or choices.

We can play games in the park or stay indoors and play video games.



Sometimes, both 'and' or 'or' can be used as the joining word.



You can have peas and carrots with your meal.

You can have peas or carrots with your meal.

Both of these sentences make sense.



When we join two sentences together, we may need to remove some of the words.

I am riding my bike in the rain. I am getting very wet.

I am riding my bike in the rain and getting very wet.

Which words have been left out in the second sentence?





When we join two sentences together, we need to make sure the capital letters and full stops are correct.

They bought a comic.

They read it on the bus.

They bought a comic. and They read it on the bus.



They bought a comic and read it on the bus.



Now that we only have one sentence, we only need one capital letter and one full stop.
