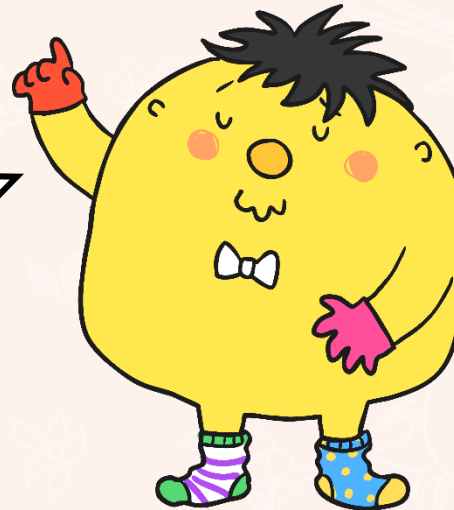

this means.



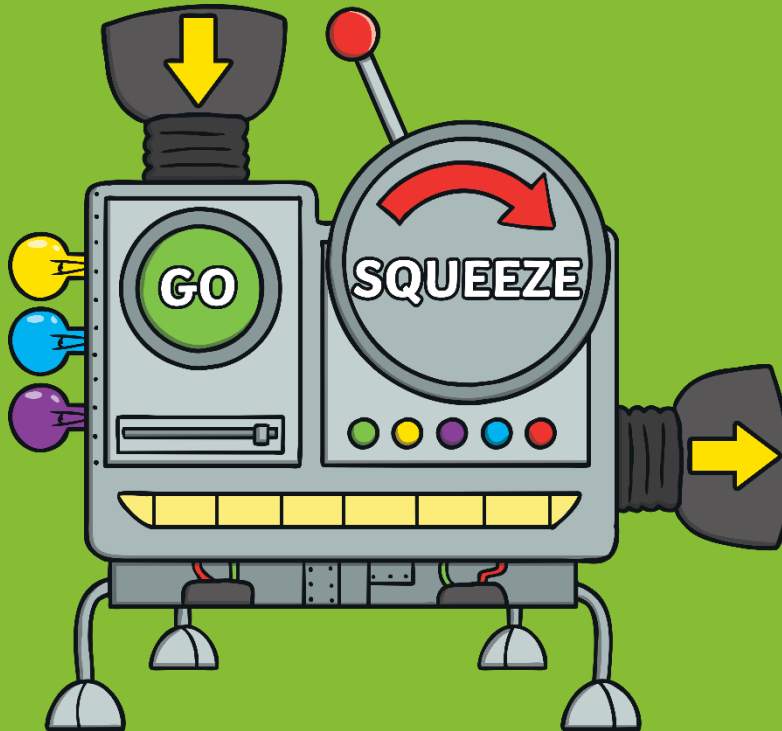
Look! Mr Whoops has squeezed two words together to make a new word.

I

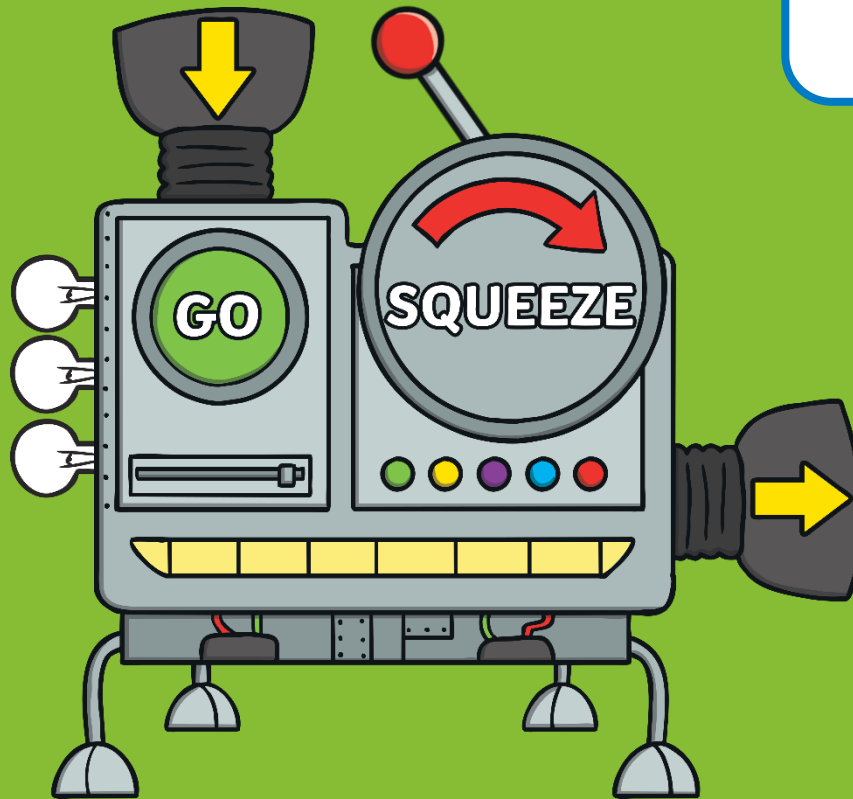
