Extension:

Remember, when we add \mathbf{s} to most words ending in \mathbf{y} we change the \mathbf{y} to \mathbf{i} and add $\mathbf{e}\mathbf{s}$, like this:

one $lolly \rightarrow three lollies$

But if the word ends in a single vowel (a e i o u) + y, we simply add s, like this:

one monkey \rightarrow three monkey \underline{s}
